## **PURPOSE:**

1. To maintain quality control and compliance with IDPH Rules and Regulations

## POLICY:

- 2. Prerequisites for EMT-B candidates for the SFV shall be:
  - a) Eighteen (18) years of age or older
    - b) High School graduate or general education equivalent
    - c) AHA CPR Healthcare Provider or higher
    - d) Adherence to the SFVEMSS Student with Disabilities policy (C-29)
- 3. Course outlines will be based on the Illinois Department of Public Health Rules and Regulations, Section 515.500, to include:
  - a. Only approved system approved instructors will be allowed for instruction
  - b. A minimum of 150 didactic hours
  - c. A minimum of 20 hours of clinical (at a system hospital) (See Policy C-18 for clinical guidelines)
- 4. The EMT Basic training program shall include individual evaluations conducted by the Course Lead Instructor during the class.
- 5. Only System approved textbooks and workbooks shall be used.
- 6. Attendance will be outlined in the student handbook.
- 7. Successful completion of the course shall be based on the student handbook.
- 8. The Student Handbook shall include:
  - a. Appropriate attendance record
  - b. Required system clinical experience
  - c. Module exam grade point average passing rate
  - d. Final written examination passing percent.
  - e. A passing grade (pass/fail) on the final practical exam
- 9. Approval of the EMS Medical Director, EMS System Coordinator and EMS Lead Instructor
- 10. Students are eligible to challenge the Illinois state examination or the National Registry exam if they have successfully completed the course
- 11. If a student does not successfully pass the examination, he/she must interview with the Course Lead Instructor and/or EMS System Coordinator before being allowed to retake the exam.
- 12. A student only has one year to complete the initial testing after completion of their training course.
- 13. All retests are based on the rules and regulations outlined by IDPH.
- 14. A maximum of three attempts are allowed to pass the State exam. If they do not successfully pass the exam they must retake the course.

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
