PURPOSE:

To set standards of eligibility for acceptance into the Southern Fox Valley EMT-P Training Program.

POLICY:

- 1. All participants in the SFVEMSS EMT-P Training Program must have successfully completed an approved EMT-B course.
- 2. All participants must have a current Illinois State EMT-B/EMT-I License.
- 3. Adherence to the SFVEMSS Student with Disabilities policy (C-29)
- 4. All applicants must provide the following:
 - a. copy of current Illinois EMT-B or EMT-I license
 - b. copy of Drivers License or state-issued ID card
 - c. high school diploma or proof of GED
 - d. high school and/or college transcripts
 - e. color photo of self
 - f. typed personal statement, stating their purpose of paramedic training
 - g. two letters of recommendation, one person, one professional
 - h. Waubonsee Requirements:
 - i. documentation of medical liability insurance
 - ii. documentation of physical examination within last 12 months
 - iii. proof of rubella vaccine or titer results within last 12 months
 - iv. proof of hepatitis vaccine or wavier of vaccine within last 12 months
 - v. results of two-step TB testing within last 12 months
 - vi. must have a current influenza vaccination.
 - vii. copy of current AHA Health Care Provider CPR card
- 5. All applicants must submit to a background check and a drug screening. (this is an extra fee that the student will pay.)
- 6. The Field Experience Agreement on the application must be complete for the application to be considered. It is the responsibility of the applicant to arrange with a SFVEMSS department for the required field experience.
- 7. All tuition and fees must be paid to Waubonsee Community College per their current tuition policy.
- 8. Current system educational needs will be considered when reviewing program applications.
- 9. Placement in the class will be based on multiple criteria, including:
 - a. score on entrance exam of at least 75%
 - b. EMS System affiliation
 - c. approval from EMS Medical Director and/or EMS System Coordinator
- 10. Student matriculation practices and student recruitment is nondiscriminatory with respect to race, age, creed, sex, sexual orientation, religion or national origin.

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
