PURPOSE:

To establish training criteria and define equivalent standards in compliance with IDPH rules and regulations.

POLICY:

- All education, training and continuing education courses for EMT-B, EMT-I, EMT-P, Pre-Hospital RN, ECRN, First Responder and Emergency Medical Dispatcher shall be coordinated by at least one approved EMS Lead Instructor.
- 2. A program may use more than one EMS Lead Instructor.
- 3. A single EMS Lead Instructor may simultaneously coordinate more than one program of course.
- 4. To apply to take the EMS Lead Instructor's examination, the candidate shall submit:
 - a. Documentation of experience and education in accordance with sub section (5) of this section.
 - b. A fee of \$50 in the form of a money order or certified check made payable to Department of Public Health (IDPH). Cash or personal check will not be accepted.
 - c. A letter from the EMS Medical Director saying he/she will approve the course conducted by the candidate.
 - d. An EMS Lead Instructor application form prescribed by the IDPH which shall include, but not be limited to name, address and resume.
- 5. An EMS Lead Instructor shall meet at least the following minimum experience and education requirements:
 - a. A current license as an EMT-B, EMT-I, EMT-P, RN or physician
 - b. A minimum of four years of experience in pre-hospital emergency care
 - c. At least two years of documented teaching experience
 - d. Documented classroom teaching experience, i.e., ITLS, PHTLS, CPR, PALS
 - e. Documented successful completion of the Illinois EMS Instructor Education Course or equivalent to the National Standard Curriculum for EMS Instructors.
- 6. Upon completion of the EMS Lead Instructor examination with a score of at least 80%, IDPH will approve the individual as an EMS Lead Instructor. The approval is valid for 4 years.
- 7. EMT-I and EMT-P Lead Instructors shall attend an IDPH-approved curriculum review course whenever revisions are made to the National Standard Curricula for Basic, Intermediate, and/or Paramedic.
- 8. To renew approval for another 4 years, the EMS Lead Instructor shall submit to IDPH at least 60 days, but not more than 90 days, prior to your expiration:
 - a. A letter of support from an EMS Medical Director indicating that you have satisfactorily coordinated programs for the EMS System at any time during the four-year period.
 - b. Documentation of at least 10 hours of continuing education annually. (Programs used to fulfill other professional CE requirements, i.e. EMT, nursing, may also be used to meet this requirement)
- 9. IDPH shall, in accordance with the rules, suspend or revoke the approval of an EMS Lead Instructor, after an opportunity for a hearing, when findings show: the EMS Lead Instructor has failed
- a. To conduct a course in accordance with the curriculum prescribed by the ACT or this policy: or To comply with protocols prescribed by this part.

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
